ST. MATTHEW'S NEW CHURCH MANAGEMENT SYSTEM



Our Communication Committee has worked very hard to investigate, purchase, and implement a new church management system. The new system will enable us to keep our parish informed and maintain our records accurately.

The program is Fellowship One. Its selection was based on research into church management systems conducted by Brogann Sanderson Bowden for a previous committee chaired by Tom DiMuzio. It was thoroughly evaluated by the current Communications Committee for functionality, reliability, disaster recovery, and security. Gary Driscoll, working closely with Pattie Curtiss, transferred our data from the old system into Fellowship One. Gary has been providing hands-on training and mentoring to Pattie on the use of the new system Other committee members involved in the evaluation included JC Kinnamon, who was our original webmaster, Bruce Weise, Jim McGuire, Lori Cooper, Tammy Eng. And, of course our Rector, Barbara, who has also been giving input about software needs and what we may need for creation of worship materials, etc. Bill Ducharme and his son Paul joined us to work on signage, and how we present ourselves in the community and beyond.

BLESSING OF THE BACKPACKS!



Christian Formation Team is born and invites you to join in the fun!

Over the past few months a small group has been meeting to begin planning for a variety of Christian Formation opportunities. Christian formation is the lifelong process of growing in our relationship with God, self, others, and all

creation. Every experience in our lives can provide us with the opportunity to express our faith; the challenge we face is recognizing these opportunities and learning ways to live a sometimes countercultural life in a secular world. This team will look for ways that will help us all live out of our Christian identity and adopt practices that lead us to perceive our true selves and our place in the world. The team needs at least six more people to contribute to and expand on some of the ideas that have recently emerged. Or, we encourage you to simply share your dream with any of its members. (For now, Sylvia Hunt, Ellie Driscoll, Paul Bell, Jim Morrison, Nora Sirbaugh and Barbara Briggs).

Christian mindfulness aids growth in the spiritual life. Contemplative practices help us find a balanced, Christian response to the busyness and consumerism that is a hallmark of American society.

We invite you to join in the effort to discern together how to foster the discovery and adoption of our true selves rather defaulting to the ambient cultural norm. All of us are called to support and help each other discover our deeper freedom in Christ—a freedom to love others and to love creation. How can we help each other live a life of wholeness and integration rather than feeling pulled in all different directions?

We have been given the gift of community so that we can listen to each other and to our true, Godgiven selves and in the process, rediscover our sense of wonder. The way to wholeness can be found in contemplative and formational practices such as:

- Silence
- Admiring nature and the beauty of the earth
- Centering prayer
- Lectio Divina
- Bible Study
- Taize-style common prayer with space for silence
- Listening deeply to self, to God and to others
- Bible Drama and role play
- Ignatian contemplation
- Ecumenical events
- Journaling
- Spiritual Conversation
- Stand alone talks and reflection on the challenges of being human
- Small group study

Your input is needed as we develop a variety of offerings such as these, and more. We will be drawing on the many gifted people in our community, (that's you), to help us live into a year of contemplation and formation, beginning in the Fall of 2016.

WOMEN'S SPIRITUALITY GROUP

Are you interested in exploring your Christian identity and spirituality in conversation with other women and with Scripture in a powerful way of connecting with the Holy Spirit? Then, join me in a women's spirituality group. We'll explore our Christian Spirituality together and support one another in our hunger for growth in faith and love. The format will be simple. In order to connect with our spiritual selves, God and each other, we will not be doing a Bible study in the traditional sense of the word. Instead,



we will give ourselves the time and space to dwell in God's Word—to let ourselves be immersed in Scripture together, (and to giggle or cry as needed). This method of Conversation with God's Word and of listening deeply to each other is called Dwelling in the Word.

We'll spend half an hour or more dwelling within a particular biblical passage. Any passage or the daily lectionary may be used. We will use the story about the sending of the 72 in Luke 10:1-6. None of us will be coming to this as an expert, but rather as fellow seekers and companions in the search for meaning on the road of life. We'll let the text expand our thinking, open new pathways, encourage creativity, and make way for the Holy Spirit. Any passage may be dwelt upon for weeks and months.

THE METHOD

- We begin with prayer
- We read the text
- We sit together with the passage, in silence and in conversation. Some questions will help us sink into the text and listen to each other, then, we close with prayer.
- We will begin on Monday, September 26 in Belmont Hall from 8-9 PM. Here is the schedule for a total of six sessions:

September 26 October 3, 24 November 7, 28 December 5

A member of St. Peter's-by-the-Light, Barnegat Light, candidate for priesthood in our Diocese, and founder of Bishop's Legal Services LLPC, Genevieve will bring her vast experience and commitment to serving the needs of older adults and their families to our service.

Following the Evensong, a reception will be held in Synod Hall. Families and friends of the honorees are welcome to attend the service and the reception. The Rev. Anne Wrede will offer guided tours of the Cathedral at 1:00 p.m.

The Committee for Ministry with Older Adults was formed in 2012 with the goal of recognizing, honoring, and utilizing the experience, wisdom, and gifts of older adults for the benefit of our churches and Diocese. We seek to advocate for respect, dignity and justice for older adults and to be a resource for their families. We wish to raise awareness of the faith and vitality that our older members bring to our Church.

At the Evensong Service we will honor older adults from your parish or diocesan organization who have demonstrated outstanding leadership, performed exemplary ministry, or served in multi-faceted ways. Please take the following steps:

- * In consultation with your wardens and vestry, select one or two older adults to honor.
- * Complete the <u>nomination form</u> online or complete the <u>attached nomination form</u> and email to <u>mclisham@dioceseofnj.org</u> or mail by August 1 to Mary Anne Clisham, Diocese of New Jersey, 808 West State Street, Trenton, NJ 08618. Be sure to include a descriptive reason (from 50 100 words) for each nomination.

THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH REQUIRES

anyone working with children to have completed a sexual abuse awareness training. In this workshop, both sexual abuse of children



and sexual exploitation and harassment of all persons are covered. This training is required every five years for clergy, wardens, employees, and anyone regularly working with or around children or youth. It is recommended for church personnel who occasionally work with or around children or youth.

You could be among those who may be upset by this requirement. At first blush, this is understandable. However, there is another way of looking at this. The more people with this training St. Matthew's has, the better the whole parish can help each other recognize if anyone needs our help or protection. The better informed we are, the better we can serve one another and care for each other. When we promised to uphold each other, which we do at every baptism when we are asked, "Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?" ACOLYTE TRAINING – SEPTEMBER 25TH



OUR GUEST PREACHER WILL BE THE REVEREND ELIZABETH GEITZ

Reverend Geist will bring us up to date on the work of the Good Shepherd Foundation for Sustainable Learning. GSFSL has completed the first phase of construction of a residential secondary school in Bafut Cameroon. St Matthew's parishioners have generously supported the project over the past two years with gifts totaling more than \$2,000.

Following both the 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. services, The Rev. Elizabeth Geist will meet with parishioners at a special extended coffee hour. A video presentation for the Cameroon will follow the 10 a.m. service.
